



COVID-19 Summer UP! COVID Protocols

The safety and health of our staff, students, parents, and visitors is our utmost priority. Our preparedness plan for managing the COVID-19 outbreak has been adapted from **CDC Guidance for Summer Camps** (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/schools-childcare/summer-camps.html>) for all group activities and includes implementing realistic, practical and acceptable practices to help reduce the spread of illness during our events.

As a reminder, COVID-19 typically spreads through respiratory droplets expelled while talking, coughing and sneezing. It may also spread from contaminated surfaces to the mouth and nose. Personal prevention practices including staying home when sick, frequent handwashing, and routine cleaning and disinfecting are key to preventing the spread of the virus.

Trinity School at Edgemere has put in place the following actions for our Summer Up! Campers, Instructors and Director to reduce the risk of COVID-19 exposure and spread during camp sessions and activities. These are detailed below with links to the CDC resources:

Trinity School's Policies Promote Behaviors that Prevent the Spread of COVID-19

- **Trinity will check and record the temperatures of all staff and campers every day.**
- **Campers MUST Stay Home If They Do Not Feel Well.** During our first day of camp our staff will educate campers and their families about when they should [stay home](#) and when they can return to camp.
 - Trinity School will actively encourage employees and campers who are sick or have recently had a [close contact](#) with a person with COVID-19 to stay home.
 - Trinity School will also require [employees and campers to stay home](#) if they have tested positive for or are showing COVID-19 [symptoms](#).

- Campers that are coughing or sneezing will be removed from the group and evaluated by the camp director immediately to determine if they are required to return home. **If you child has allergies, please inform the staff.**
- **Campers will Frequently Wash Their Hands and Sanitize**
 - Campers will be required to frequently wash their hands between all activities.
 - Personal Hand Sanitizer will also be issued and carried by all campers.
 - Signs will be posted to remind campers to wash their hands.
 - Time will be built into the daily schedule to allow for frequent handwashing.
- **Cleaning and Disinfecting will be Routine**
 - Trinity School's Custodial team and Camp Staff will [Clean and disinfect](#) frequently touched surfaces (e.g., playground equipment, door handles, sink handles, drinking fountains) within the camp facility and in any [shared transportation](#) vehicles at least daily or between use as much as possible.
- A schedule for increased, routine cleaning and disinfection will be followed.

Shared Objects

- Campers will be provided their own material and will not share them with others.
 - All items that require sharing will be cleaned and disinfected.
 - Each Camper's belongings will be separated from others' and in individually labeled containers, cubbies, or areas.
 - Sharing electronic devices, toys, books, and other games or learning aids will be prohibited.
- **Modified Layouts**
 - Students for Academic Intensives and Camp Activities will be spaces 6 feet apart when possible.
 - Social distancing will be maintained during outdoor activities as much as possible.
 - Campers will be grouped together and stay in their groups throughout camp activities.

Food Service

- Campers will bring their own meals and eat with their smaller group, instead of in a communal dining hall or cafeteria.
- When needed, disposable food service items (utensils, dishes) will be used.
- If food is offered at any event, have pre-packaged boxes or bags for each attendee instead of a buffet or family-style meal.
